This program furthers the Department's mission by sponsoring research to provide objective, independent, evidence-based knowledge and tools to meet the challenges of crime and justice, particularly at the State and local levels.

To become certified, the law enforcement agency must meet two mandatory conditions: (1) the agency's use-of-force policies adhere to all applicable federal, state, and local laws and (2) the agency's use-of-force policies prohibit chokeholds except in situations where use of deadly force is allowed by law. The certification requirement also applies to law enforcement agencies receiving DOJ discretionary grant funding through a subaward. Program Description

Overview

With this solicitation, NIJ seeks to continue funding the Criminal Justice Testing and Evaluation Consortium. The consortium informs NIJ's research and development efforts, as well as NIJ's stakeholders — criminal justice practitioners, policymakers, researchers, federal partners, and private industry by: 1) conducting technology foraging activities to identify technologies for potential use by criminal justice communities; 2) conducting characterization/comparative testing and evaluations on technologies and practices to disseminate information and/or promising practices for adoption; 3) administering the NIJ Compliance Testing Program (CTP); and 4) supporting the development, validation, and maintenance of criminal justice equipment standards.

Statutory Authority: Title I of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (sections 201 and 202); the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (sections 231-233, 235); and 28 U.S.C. 530C.

Specific Information

The competitive FY2018 NIJ solicitation: Criminal Justice Testing and Evaluation Consortium, under which the award was originally made, sought applications for funding for the establishment of a Criminal Justice Testing and Evaluation Consortium (CJTEC). The consortium provides testing, evaluation, and other activities to support the safety, effectiveness, efficiency, and efficacy of technologies and practices in use or adaptable by criminal justice communities.

Goals, Objectives, Deliverables, and Timeline

The goal of this solicitation is to continue to provide testing and evaluation activities to inform NIJ's non-forensic research and development efforts, and to inform the criminal justice field concerning technologies and practices in a more innovative, sustainable, efficient, and effective manner.

The consortium's activities will be developed collaboratively between the applicant and NIJ, with substantial involvement by NIJ. The consortium will focus on a number of activities including: secondary research; applied scientific research and evaluation; and activities focused on testing to determine the technical performance of developmental and commercial technologies for the purposes of characterization and/or comparison. That testing will be conducted either in the laboratory or in the field, depending on the type and maturity of the technology, and may take the form of demonstrations. The award will not involve technology development.

The consortium will also support the NIJ Standards and Testing program, which includes the administration of the NIJ Compliance Testing Program (CTP) and support of the development, validation, and maintenance of NIJ voluntary, consensus standards. The goal of this program is to help ensure that technologies acquired and employed by criminal justice agencies are safe and effective.

The Goals, Objectives, and Deliverables are directly related to the performance measures that demonstrate the results of the work completed, as discussed under Content of Application Submission.

This abstract should be written in the third person and will be made publicly available on the OJP website if the project is awarded.

Proposal Narrative

The proposal narrative should be submitted as an attachment in JustGrants. The attached document should be double-spaced, using a standard 12-point Times New Roman font; have no less than 1-inch margins; and should not exceed 30 pages. Pages should be numbered and submitted as an attachment. If the proposal narrative fails to comply with these length restrictions, NIJ may negatively consider such noncompliance in final award decisions.

Describe why this project/ these proposed activities are necessary (significance/value) and/or address a need and include supporting information.

b. Project Design and Implementation

Describe the strategy to address the needs identified in the Description of the Issue/Statement of the Problem. List the proposed program activities and describe how they relate to the stated objectives. Activities are the specific actions to be undertaken to fulfill the program objectives and reach the program goal(s). Provide a detailed description of the method(s) to be used to carry out each activity. Provide a timetable indicating roughly when activities or program milestones are to be accomplished.

c. Capabilities and Competencies

Describe the capabilities and competencies to accomplish the goals and objectives of the project.

d. Plan for Collecting the Data Required for this Solicitation’s Performance Measures

Describe the process for measuring project performance. Identify who will collect the data; who is responsible for performance measurements; and how the information will be used to guide and evaluate the impact of the

project. Describe the process to accurately report data.

Note: applicants are **not** required to submit performance data with the application. Rather, performance measures information is included as an alert that successful applicants will be required to submit performance data as part of the reporting requirements under an award.
