NIJ's mission

• Improving knowledge and understanding of crime and justice issues through science



National Institute of Justice (NIJ) - Overview

- Sits within the Office of Justice Programs
- NIJ has two research offices
 - Office of Research, Evaluation, and Technology
 - Office of Investigative and Forensic Sciences
- NIJ hosts <u>CrimeSolutions.ojp.gov</u>, a repository of evaluation evidence



First Step Act

- FSA
 - Passed into law in December 2018
- Overarching goal of Title I
 - Reduce recidivism among the federal prison population
- Core statutory obligations
 - Constitution of an Independent Review Committee
 - Development of a risk and needs assessment system for the Federal Bureau of Prisons (BOP)



Review and Validation Mandates

Title I requirements

"... on an annual basis, review, validate, and release publicly on the Department of Justice website the <mark>risk and needs assessment system</mark>, which review shall include —

(A) any subsequent changes to the risk and needs assessment system made after the date of enactment of [the FSA];

(B) the recommendations developed under paragraph (2) [of 18 U.S.C. 3631], using the research conducted under paragraph (3);



Review and Validation Mandates

Title I requirements (cont'd)

(C) an evaluation to ensure that the risk and needs assessment system bases the assessment of each prisoner's risk of recidivism on indicators of progress and of regression that are dynamic and that can reasonably be expected to change while in prison;

(D) statistical validation of any tools that the risk and needs assessment system uses; and

(E) an evaluation of the rates of recidivism among similarly classified prisoners to identify any unwarranted disparities, including disparities among similarly classified prisoners of different demographic groups, in such rates ..."



First Step Act Risk Assessment Tool

Prisoner Assessment Tool Targeting Estimated Risk and Needs (PATTERN)

- 15 factors (dynamic and static)
- Created using data from sample of ~225,000 individuals released from BOP custody
- Used in concert with BOP's classification assessment, BRAVO (Bureau Risk Assessment Verification and Observation)
- Revised risk assessment tool released in January 2020



Bureau of Prisons (BOP) Needs Assessment System

- Needs assessed at intake; reassessment occurs at least semi-annually •
- **Standardized Prisoner Assessment for Reduction in Criminality** • (SPARC-13)
 - Assesses the following 13 needs:
 - Anger/Hostility Antisocial Peers Mental Health Cognitions Education Dyslexia Family/Parenting Finance/Poverty

Medical Recreation/Leisure/Fitness Substance Abuse Trauma Work



Current Funding Initiative

Goal

• Support a team of consultants to review and validate SPARC-13 annually for up to 3 years

Expectations

- Collaborate and meet regularly with NIJ and BOP
- Work in parallel with the PATTERN team to meet the Title I mandate
- Successfully pass DOJ background investigation
- Submit quarterly reports detailing progress
- Assist in the preparation of an annual report to Congress



Submission Critical Elements

Critical elements

- Narrative
- Curriculum vitae or resume
 - Consultant and support staff, as needed
- List of additional support staff, as needed
- List of any previous and current NIJ awards to the consultant
- Research and evaluation independence and integrity statement



Submission Evaluation Criteria

External experts reviewers will evaluate each submission on

- Statement of the Problem and Research Questions (10%)
- Project Design and Implementation (60%)
- Potential Impact (5%)
- Capabilities and Competencies (25%)



Important Considerations

*Support for this funding initiative will be made in the form of a contract. This is *not* a solicitation.

*<u>Only</u> qualified individuals can submit responses to this funding initiative.

*Submissions from entities other than individuals will not be considered.

*A submission may include <u>only 1</u> individual labeled as a consultant. A submission on behalf of a team of consultants will not be responsive.



Important Considerations (cont'd)

*Submissions may include support staff as needed, for example, a research assistant.

*Consultants will be unable to publish or otherwise disseminate any information generated from this initiative.

*The budget for each consultant will be determined *after* selection.
